

American Society of Addiction Medicine (ASAM) Virtual Course ASAM-II Criteria Skill Building Course

The American Society of Addiction Medicine (ASAM) Criteria course, ASAM-II is designed to help health care professionals develop a holistic understanding of the ASAM criteria and explore their role in constructing a full range of services for the treatment of individuals with substance use disorders (SUD). The ASAM-II training is a follow up from ASAM training that took place in late 2019 and early 2020. The course builds upon foundational concepts of the historical ASAM criteria that will offer practical guidelines to drive objective decision making and ensure fidelity to the ASAM criteria. Using a practical and case-based approach, ASAM-II participants will explore important considerations in developing individualized treatment plans (ITPs), evaluating progress versus nonprogress in treatment, and determining when it is appropriate to initiate transfer or discharge a patient from treatment. Further, the ASAM-II training will provide tools and resources to equip healthcare providers to work effectively in managed care settings and explore how case shaping can drive patients' overall quality of care.

While it is not a requirement that you took the initial ASAM training, the ASAM-II training is meant for those with an intermediate to advanced level of understanding of the ASAM criteria.


